Caleb Muncrief rushed for 146 yards and five touchdowns as Madill dominated Marietta in a 42-14 victory on the road last Thursday.

Madill (6-2,3-1) scored 21 points in the first quarter alone. The opening quarter was highlighted by nose tackle Shadow Marris' interception return to the Marietta one-yard line to set up Muncrief's second score of the night. The 'Cats led 28-0 by halftime after TD runs of 27 and six yards by Muncrief. Several Madill reserves saw action in the second half.



Marietta's Weston Birks scored twice for the Indians in the third quarter. Eleven different players carried the ball for the Wildcats. These included Paten Bond, Muncrief, Jake Vinson, Holden Cass, Tony Ibarra, Buddy Tyner, Tyler Cumpton, Camerun Sanders, Michael Schulke and Joe Avery, and Aaron Harding. Harding scored Madill's final touchdown in the fourth quarter on an 11-yard run. Madill rushed for 307 yards and passed for 10. Marietta was held to 82 yards on the ground and 66 through the air.

They received certificates.


